

Use these activities to help your students discriminate between a letter, number, word and a sentence.

Included are:

- 1. Cards to sort for letters, numbers, words, and sentences. Use the pocket chart and have students help you sort the cards.
 - 2. Worksheets for students to color the letter, word, number or sentence.
- 3. Letters in my name/not in my name worksheet. Just write the letters in the student's name in the boxes and then some letters as distractors.



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
